

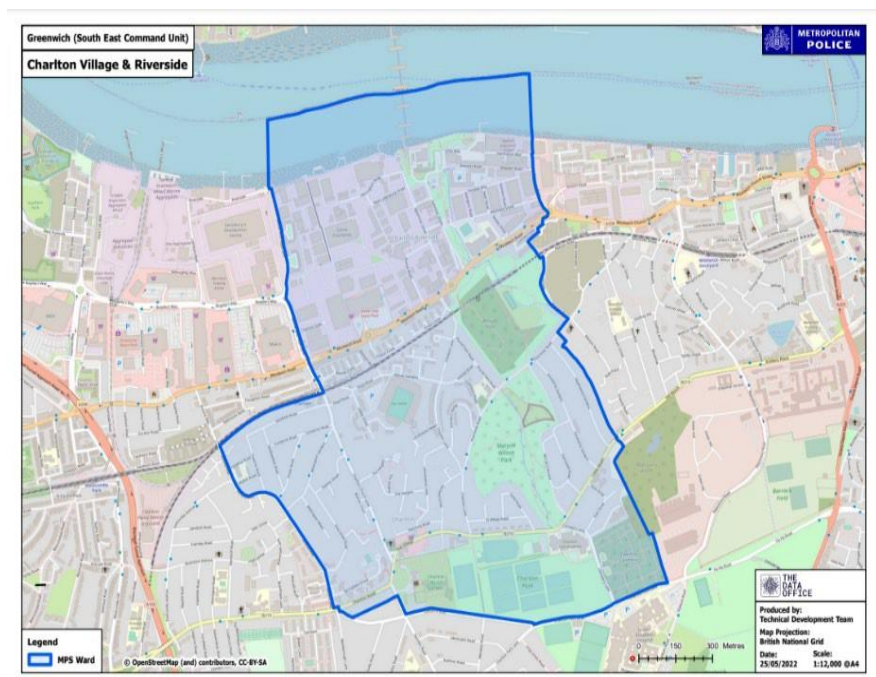
# Charlton Village & Riverside Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter May 2026 Greenwich Police



## Charlton Village & Riverside – Community Safety Updates

Over the past month in response to reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) across the ward the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) has continued targeted patrols in the specific areas, including:

- The Village
- The Heights
- The Thames Barrier
- Maryon Park and Maryon Wilson Park
- Charlton Station
- Charlton House
- Charlton Park
- Charlton Lane
- Charlton Church Lane
- Delafield Road
- Barney Close
- Wellington Gardens
- Pound Park Road
- The Valley
- Valley Groove
- Victoria Way
- Woodland Terrace.



We've been carrying out reassurance visits and increasing patrols in locations affected by vehicle thefts and residential burglaries and general anti-social behaviour.

By taking small precautions and sharing the right information, we can help protect homes and vehicles.

Regular contact with victims also improves intelligence gathering, giving us a clearer picture of the issues so we can plan effective responses.

## **Ward Priorities**

The ward priorities for Charlton Village & Riverside Ward are:

- **Charlton Park and surrounding environs - Drug Dealing and ASB Hotspot through targeted patrols, stop and search and intelligence development. Areas of focus are Charlton Park incorporating Charlton House.**
    - Extra hi-visibility patrols
    - Reassurance visits to victims and local residents
    - Stop and search around these areas
    - Intelligence development
  - **Reduction in Crime and anti-social behaviour within Charlton Village.**
    - Increase in patrols within specified areas.
    - Utilizing stop and search powers in specified areas.
    - Engagement with businesses in area to build intelligence.
    - Identify repeat offenders and bring to justice.
  - **Charlton Church Lane - Targeting Anti Social behaviour, including drug use including surroundings such as Floyd Road (CAFC), Charlton Train Station and business premises.**
    - Increase of patrols in area
    - Combination of plain clothes and uniform patrols.
    - Stop/searches fed back via Newsletter.

## **What your local SNT have been doing.**

- Officers from both Charlton Village and Riverside and Charlton Hornfair have joined forces to conduct Op Retail patrols which have accumulated in an arrest of a prolific shoplifter and multiple other charges. The male has now been charged.
- Officers have been subtracted for multiple AID Taskings in central London, such as marches, parades and protests.
- Robbery reassurance patrols were carried out by SNT due to recent reports of robberies around Charlton station and also Charlton Park. Suspect chased by Charlton Officers on cycle patrol, but lost due to suspect being on an E-Bike, although identity confirmed. Suspect was also in possession of a machete.
- Continued reassurance patrols around Charlton Village and especially around ST Lukes Church after a female reported an assault from that location. Also high visibility patrols carried out at Charlton Park and Mayron Wilson Park.
- SNT have conducted foot, cycle and mobile,(both covert and overt) patrols around Charlton Village & Riverside hotspots. This resulted in multiple intelligence reports, community resolutions for drug possession.
- Continued high visibility patrols around the retail outlets of Charlton Ward including the Op Retail Patrols, due to high crime figures of shoplifting in the Charlton Village area. This was designed to provide reassurance to shopkeepers and the public alike, be a visible deterrent, gather intelligence and to prosecute those responsible for the offences, this tasking has been ongoing from last month and is likely to be in place for the foreseeable future.
- The Safer Neighbourhood Team continue to work closely with Charlton Athletic Football Club, supporting youth community recruitment events and operating as the VAWG unit on match days.

This engagement continues to receive very positive feedback from the community and contributed to improvements in Metropolitan Police data systems.

- Officers attended several Mental Health Assessments within the Charlton area, supporting individuals in accessing the medical assistance they required.
- Officers from Charlton SNT patrolled the local elections in Charlton. Providing visible reassurance to staff members and voters alike
- Officers from Blackheath and Westcombe have joined Charlton Village and Riverside and Charlton Hornfair under Sergeant Matt Hoyne-Butler. They can potentially provide extra numbers if we potentially need.
- There have been 31 stop and searches conducted by officers in Charlton Village and Riverside Ward. These searches are for a wide range of issues including vehicle stops and misuse of drugs.

## Arrest Enquiries

Our Safer Neighbourhoods team continue to be actively involved in a number of successful arrest enquiries across Charlton Village & Riverside Ward and surrounding areas. We work closely with neighbouring ward teams to ensure a coordinated approach to policing. By supporting each other across ward boundaries, we help maintain a consistent and visible presence in the community, even when local officers are off duty.

## MET ENGAGE- Our engagement platform

The new MET ENGAGE platform allows residents to connect with local officers, shape policing priorities, and receive tailored safety advice. It's a two-way tool – you can share your main concerns while staying updated on our work in your area. Met Engage continues to be an invaluable platform to receive and share intel with residents.
